Cybersecurity is the top threat facing business and critical infrastructures in the United States, according to reports and testimony from the Director of National Intelligence, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the Department of Homeland Security. All drinking and wastewater systems should examine cybersecurity vulnerabilities and develop a cybersecurity risk management program, thus mitigating a cyberattack from impacting system operations.
